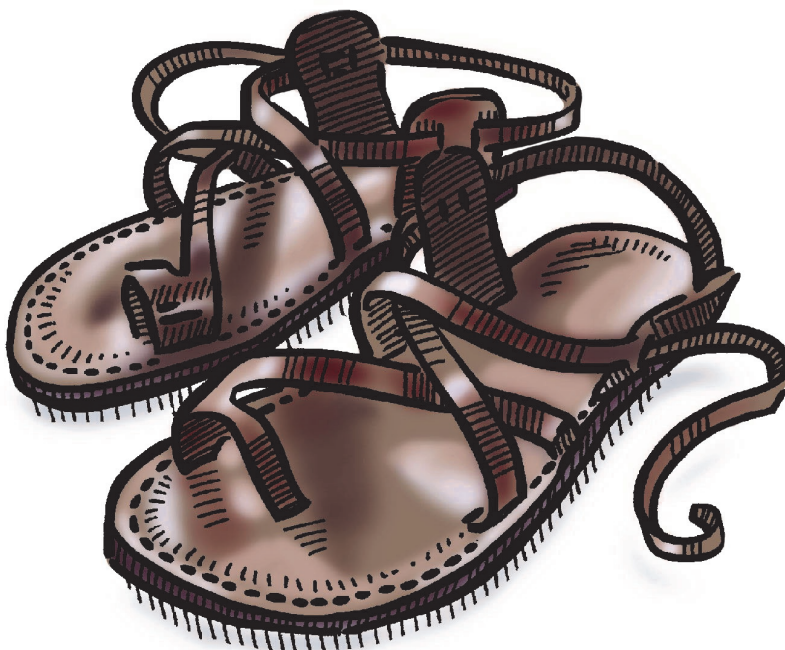

**AN ADVENT REFLECTION**



The raising of one's mind and heart to God in thanksgiving and in praise of his glory. It can also include the requesting of good things from God. It is an act by which one enters into awareness of a loving communion with God. "Prayer is the response of faith to the free promise of salvation and also a response of love to the thirst of the only Son of God" (CCC, no. 2561).

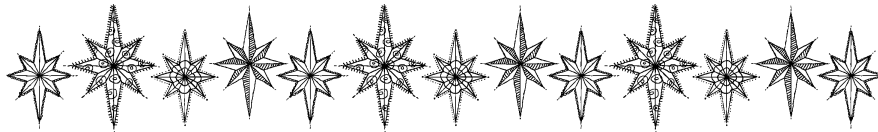

Descriptions of prayer are abundant throughout Christian history. "True prayer," wrote St. Augustine, "is nothing but love." Prayer should arise from the heart. "Prayer," said St. John Vianney, "is the inner bath of love into which the soul plunges itself." "Everyone of us needs half an hour of prayer each day," remarked St. Francis de Sales, "except when we are busy—then we need an hour." Definitions of prayer are important, but insufficient. There is a huge difference between knowing about prayer and praying. On this issue, the Rule of St. Benedict is clear, "If a man wants to pray, let him go and pray."

St. John Damascene gave a classic definition of prayer: "Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God" (CCC, no. 2559, citing St. John Damascene, *De Fide Orth.* 3, 24).

The *Catechism* clearly defines prayer as a "vital and personal relationship with the living and true God" (CCC, no. 2558). Prayer is Christian "insofar as it is communion with Christ" (CCC, no. 2565), and a "covenant relationship between God and man in Christ" (CCC, no. 2564).

Every time I sit in the Church during Advent and watch the candles being lit on the Advent wreath one by one, it always takes me back to my childhood. I remember the excitement of watching the candles at Mass bring me one week closer to the arrival of..... Santa! Even though my childhood was not accompanied by deep theological thoughts of the coming of the Savior, the Advent rituals of my youth helped to shape my adult observance of Advent.

I sometimes hear that parents do not go to Church because of squirming and sometimes less than cooperative toddlers. But even before they are able to understand the words and the gestures of Mass, they are learning some very important things about God and about their parent's faith! First they learn that Mass is something important because their parents do it every week. Our children are also absorbing the differences of the Liturgical Year. It is impossible to see the Advent Wreath and the majestic banners behind the choir, and the deacons singing petitions and not realize that there is something special going on! Even before these toddlers can appreciate that a whisper is better than a scream during the Gospel, they are reaping the blessings of our Lord and spiritual graces of being with their faith community, and adoring our Lord in the sacred Eucharist. Parents too are benefitting, even if they are trying to keep their little ones quiet through much of the Mass. These are the spiritual gifts of fortitude, counsel and understanding. For those of you who just need an hour of peace with your God, we do offer a nursery for those under 3 years of age and a pre-school for ages 3-6 at the 9:30 a.m. Mass.

If your children are pre-school or older, you will find many family advent activities and devotionals on our parish book rack in the narthex. These are easy and fun-filled activities to make sure the season of Advent is not forgotten in your home with all the hustle and bustle! For adults, our magazines are filled with articles and devotions for the season as well. Many people are still out of work or underemployed during this holiday season. Please do not let cost keep you away from the book rack. If you are not able to pay the price listed, simply pay whatever you are able.

So this Christmas season, as you are making your lists and checking them twice, be sure to remember to spiritually spoil yourself and your children with prayers, Mass and other devotionals!
